- The EAST Shelter is closing their doors at the current location
- The EAST Shelter will reopen a facility by Mesa Dr. and Baseline Rd.
- The new facility will house the same number of animals.
- This does not allow for the expanding East valley population.
- MCACC currently handles over 36,000 animals annually.

- ► The EAST Valley will be underserved by MCACC.
- All owner surrenders will be by appointment only and only if space allows.
- They will focus on only stray dogs.







THE BIG PICTURE




- ► The population of Phoenix currently is 4,800,00 residents.

- Population estimates call for the valleys population to grow steadily through 2050.

ESTIMATED POPULATION BY YEAR PHOENIX METRO AREA










PHOENIX METRO ESTIMATED POPULATION GROWTH BY YEAR

The Problem



- Shelters and Rescues are in a constant state of overcrowding causing euthanasia of healthy animals.
- Shelters and Rescues constantly say "I wish we had more room". "Wish we had more foster homes". "We want to help".
- Fosters are getting Increasingly difficult to attract.
- Care for the very young is even more difficult.
- Often these are the most euthanized type of animal.









- Purchasing 30,000+ S.F. facility.
- 25,000 S.F dedicated to shared shelter center.
- 5,000 S.F. dedicated to premium boarding for dogs and cats.
- This area will also provide doggy daycare and dog training, grooming, and boarding
- Profits from daycare, training, grooming and boarding will help reduce costs.









- Shared space for rescues allowing overhead costs to be reduced and shared.
- Housing for all participating rescues.
- Facility open to public 9am-9pm, 7 days a week.
- Rescues can conduct adoptions at facility.
- Rescues can have their volunteers work their animals.
- Animals can be maintained by facility personnel.
- Animals can be adopted by facility personnel
- House up to 500 animals at a time.
- Maximum stay 2 weeks or negotiable
- Space can be rented by the month, or year.









- Facility will contain fully staffed nursery staffed 24 hours daily including bottle feeding.
- Facility will have quarantine area for dogs and cats.
- Facility will have sick rooms for dogs and cats.
- Facility will have treatment area for sick animals.
- High requirements for cleanliness to reduce pathogens.
- Animals must be vaccinated and tested before using any shared space.









- Regular health assessment conducted by animal.
- Provide low cost treatment.
- Provide low cost/free altering.
- Provide low Cost/free Vaccination Clinic.
- Food/ Litter supplied pet food manufacturers.
- Veterinary clinic will be on site.
